In the line, Cochrane depends on guard Bob Zakhar, ends Gene Torpey and Bill O'Day, and tackle Len Franco.

THE WRAP-UP—Snyder has held its two opponents to less than 70 yards rushing in two games. The Tigers have been instilled with a spirit that has been unknown at the Greenville school. St. Peter's has a potent running game in Mendolla and Crowe that should keep the Snyder forward wall busy. Snyder's pass defense hasn't been tested thoroughly and the likes of Jack O'Dea and ends Gene Torpey and Bill O'Day should make the difference in the game. Snyder winning streak should be broken.
